Town of Zionsville Submits Grant Applications for Road Projects

Mayor Tim Haak and Town of Zionsville Officials on Friday, July 29, 2016 submitted a list of nearly \$3.05 million in proposed road projects to the Indiana Department of Transportation in a bid to maximize matching grant potentials through the Community Crossings matching grant program.

Mayor Tim Haak noted “I am very excited about this opportunity to potentially bring additional paving and road rehabilitation work to town while decreasing the local dollars spent. I cannot speculate on how competitive this state-wide process will be, but if we can get just one project funded, it will be a win for the Town. Even if we are not selected for funding, this is a great opportunity to demonstrate to the legislature the enormous needs across the entire state.”

Street and Storm Water Superintendent Lance Lantz added “Detailed estimates were provided to INDOT with the applications. If awarded any projects, actual costs as provided under a construction contract will be used to calculate the ultimate 50-50- split”.
