Town of Zionsville rejoins partnership with Boone EDC

The Town of Zionsville is reengaging with the Boone County Economic Development Corporation (Boone EDC). During the Town Council meeting on January 16, Mayor John Stehr asked for, and Town Council members unanimously passed, a resolution to appropriate funds to the Boone EDC for their 2024 services.

Boone EDC, a nonprofit organization, is dedicated to the growth of Boone County by actively engaging with businesses, developers, consultants, real estate brokers, public officials and the community. Their vision is for the community to thrive as a diverse and resilient economic hub, offering opportunities for everyone.

The Town of Zionsville has historically had a partnership with the Boone EDC to assist the Town in economic development. Mayor Stehr has prioritized reengaging with the Boone EDC by appropriating money from the Food and Beverage Fund for economic development services.
